Lady Jays edge Splendora in battle of ranked teams; Lamar goes down in finals

NEEDVILLE — Needville rallied from 3-1 and 4-2 deficits to upend Splendora in eight innings, 5-4, in a battle of state-ranked teams Friday night at Blue Jay Sports Complex.

The Lady Jays scored two in the bottom of the seventh to tie the game, then tallied in the bottom of the eighth.

With one out, Julie Kalmus singled to right, stole second and reached third on a grounder. Cierra Wieghat then singled up the middle, scoring Kalmus.

Down by two in the seventh, Needville tied it when Wieghat scored on an error and Shelby Parham singled to right, driving in Becca Rademacher.

Needville took a 1-0 lead in the second when Courtney Cox reached on a fielder choice and eventually scored on a error on Cally Falls' grounder to short.

After Splendora scored three unearned runs in the fourth on a bases-clearing double by Shelby Kimmons, the Lady Jays got a run back in the sixth when Parham doubled to right center and scored on a Kalmus base hit.

LCISD Tournament

Lamar Consolidated fell to La Marque 7-3 in the Silver Bracket title game at the LCISD Tournament.

The Lady Mustangs reached the finals with wins over Cedar Hill (14-0), Stratford (3-2) and Spring Woods (3-0).

Marissa Thome (4 RBIs) and Elyssa Alvarado both went 4-for-4 with a triple and two doubles. Annalise Romo added a two-run HR

in first.

In addition, Megan Elledge three singles, Cassie Faucher drove in two runs with two hits and Colleen Blinka added two singles.

In the win over Stratford, Romo struck out seven to get the win. She also had two singles and drove in a run. Alvarado scored twice and singled.
