Lady Jays finish 4-2 at Brazoswood ISD Varsity Tournament

LAKE JACKSON — Needville closed Brazoswood ISD tournament play Saturday with a win over Galveston Ball (15-0) and a loss to Pasadena Memorial (9-4).
