East Bernard moves to 7-0; Lady Rangers deny Stafford

LLEXINGTON — East Bernard got All-star play from Courtney Repka en route to four straight wins and the championship of the Lexington Tournament.

The Brahmarettes beat host Lexington in the title game 4-1 as Repka slammed a three-run homer in the top of the seventh. She was named Tournament Most Valuable Player, while catcher Liz Reyes was named to the All-Tournament Team.

East Bernard reached the finals with a 10-0 rout of Centerville as Repka threw a shutout and struck out 15.

In the tourney opener, Repka threw a perfect game to spark a 4-0 victory over La Grange. The Brahmarettes then edged Rockdale 1-0 as Repka allowed just two hits and fanned 17, and Erica Reyes drove in the only run in the eighth.

For the four games, Repka allowed just eight hits and struck out 62 in 29 innings pitched.

Leading East Bernard's hitting attack were Repka with six hits, Brittney Wilcox with five and three apiece from Liz Reyes, Anna Giannetti, Erica Reyes and Cameron Kieler.

EAST BERNARD — East Bernard (7-0) needed just three

innings to blister Hempstead in Tuesday night's District 26-2A opener at Koym Field.

Pitcher Courtney Repka gave up a two-out single to Amanda Uvalle for Hempstead's only hit in the bottom of the first. She went on to strike out seven, giving her 98 through seven games.

The Brahmarettes exploded for five runs in bottom of the first, keyed by RBI hits by Erica Reyes and Brittney Wilcox (two hits), and a bases-loaded walk by Ashley Anderson. Liz Reyes also went 3-for-4 and scored twice.

A nine-run second, spared by two-run singles by Anderson and Liz Reyes, upped the lead to 14-0.
