The lone Lady Ranger run came across in the first. Laura Martinez bunted her way on, stole second and scored on Huebotter's base hit to right center.

Travis 4, Kempner 2

Travis struck for three runs in the

third en route to a big District 23-5A victory over Kempner Tuesday at Lady Tiger Field.

Two-out RBI hits by Holly Berger and Kim Pepper in the third staked Travis (7-3 in district) to an early 3-0 lead.

After Kempner closed the gap to 3-2 in the fourth, the Lady Tigers added an insurance run in the sixth when Berger tripled and scored on a Kaitlyn Jones single.

Berger caught a bunt pop and doubled off a runner at first to halt a Lady Cougar threat in the seventh.
