Needville, East Bernard, Travis open in impressive fashion

HEMPSTEAD TOURNAMENT

HEMPSTEAD — Needville routed three opponents in pool play before Saturday's finals were canceled due to rain.

The Lady Jays outscored its opponents 46-0 in the three wins, none of which went more than four innings. Pitching allowed just three hits in the three wins.

Needville blistered Hempstead 17-0. Cally Falls and Shelby Parham had three hits each, and two hits were added by Jenny Stack, Courtney Cox and Cierra Wieghat.

In the next game, Needville hammered Milano, 14-0. Falls had three hits, Cox delivered two

hits and solo hits were added by Cox, Wieghat, Kayla Johns, Becca Rademacher and Lenzie Leonhardt.

In Game 3, the Lady Jays pounded out 17 hits en route to a 15-0 destruction of Navasota. Raking two hits apiece were Johns, Rademacher, Falls, Kirby Jan and Julie Kalmus.

East Bernard also advanced to Saturday's finals with impressive wins over Rice Consolidated (5-0) and Stafford (5-0).

In the win over Rice, Courtney Repka threw the first of her two no-hitters, fanning 12 in a perfect game effort.

Repka also had two hits, while Liz Reyes and Cameron Kieler each drove in two runs.
